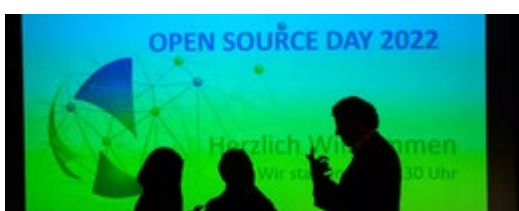


New Partnership with Swiss company Verein
