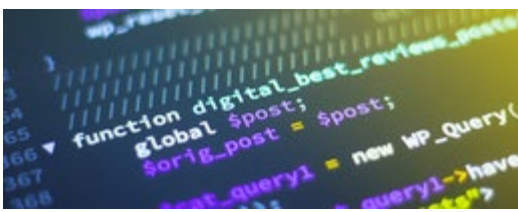

Schleswig-Holstein focusses on digital sovereignty

The administration of Schleswig-Holstein will be the first federal state to set up a digitally sovereign IT workplace. With a cabinet decision to introduce the open-source software LibreOffice as the standard office solution across the board, the government has made a start towards complete digital sovereignty for the state. Transatlantic data protection remains problematic: OSBA in dialogue with Max Schrems

Transatlantic data protection remains a sellout. Despite numerous agreements and regulations, there are still considerable differences between European data protection standards and those of the USA. This leads to great uncertainty among companies and consumers, especially with regard to the protection of personal data. In an interview with the Open Source Business Alliance (OSBA), Austrian data protection activist Max Schrems goes into detail (German only).

Did you know?

In 1988, Robert Tappan Morris developed the *Morris Worm*, one of the first major 'internet worms'. Originally intended as an experiment to measure the structure and scope of the Internet, the worm spread rapidly and uncontrollably due to a programming error and paralysed thousands of computers. As a result, Morris was convicted of violating the *Computer Fraud and Abuse Act*. The incident was a wake-up call for the IT world, leading to increased awareness of cyber security and better security measures.
